Celebrating Matariki

Matariki marks the Māori New Year, signified by the rising of the Matariki star cluster, also known as the Pleiades. This celestial event is a time of reflection, remembrance, and renewal. Traditionally, it is a period to acknowledge the year's harvest, share kai, and plan for the future.

A Time of Harvest and Shared Kai

Matariki is a time to celebrate the bounty of the land. It is an opportunity for us to come together as a school community to share food, stories, and traditions. Upcoming Events


To celebrate Matariki, we have planned a week of activities and events:

To begin our week the school will come together on Monday, sharing whole school Timatanga, and then see our potiki Kapa Haka (Juniors) perform to the school.

On Monday & Tuesday afternoons classes will work with their buddy classes, using tuakana-teina, to support one another around the theme of Matariki. During the week the Library will host numerous activities from storytelling, colouring competitions and scavenger hunts.

On Wednesday, we will have a special Matariki assembly where students will celebrate Matariki with a variety of performances. **We invite whānau to join us from 11.35am.**

On Wednesday afternoon we will have shared kai in each syndicate discussing the significance of the harvest. Each Family will be asked to contribute a **small** ziplock bag of chopped vegetables to demonstrate how we can each bring something small and create a communal meal together of vegetable soup served with Fry bread.
