Based on your feedback, we have decided to adopt a new approach this year, implementing an A and B year for the Country Fair. This year's event, **scheduled for Friday 1st November**, will be a smaller-scale version of the Fair, focusing on fostering a sense of community. The afternoon and evening will be filled with opportunities to share food, enjoy each other's company, and watch a movie together under the stars, picnicking on the school field.

This scaled-back version will allow us to focus on the simple joys of coming together, without the pressures of a larger event. A community letter will be sent home soon, outlining how you can help us prepare for this special evening. We hope to see as many of you there as possible, enjoying the warmth and connection that our school community is known for.

Health and Safety Enhancements

In our ongoing efforts to ensure the safety and well-being of our students, we will be initiating some important work around the school to enhance our Health and Safety measures. Following recent assessments and in close collaboration with the Ministry of Education, we have become increasingly aware of the growing traffic concerns on both Austin Road and State Highway 14.

To address these concerns, we will be beginning the process of erecting a fence around the school perimeter. This fence is designed solely to keep our tamariki safe during school hours, particularly in light of the busy roads nearby. I want to emphasise that this fence is not intended to keep our community out. We value the role our school grounds play as a gathering place for the community, and we will continue to keep the grounds open after hours and on weekends. We appreciate your understanding and support as we undertake these necessary improvements. The safety of our students is our top priority, and we are committed to ensuring that our school remains a secure and welcoming environment for everyone.

Focus on Attendance - Late Arrivals

At Maunu School, we deeply value the importance of regular attendance, as it is a key factor in ensuring the success and well-being of our students. We've previously discussed the significant impact that absenteeism can have on a child's learning journey, and today I want to address another issue that is affecting our students: Lateness to school.

The Impact of Being Late

Arriving late to school might seem like a minor inconvenience, but research shows that it can have a substantial impact on your child's day. Children who arrive after the bell are starting their day on the back foot, missing out on crucial settling-in time, morning routines, and initial instructions. This can create a ripple effect throughout the day, affecting their ability to focus, engage in lessons, and keep up with their peers.

Taking Action

To support our students and help them thrive, we will be sending home some data in the coming weeks to families who regularly arrive after the bell. This information is meant to be a constructive tool to help you recognise patterns and make adjustments where necessary. Our goal is to ensure that every child at Maunu School has the best possible start to their day, every day.

How You Can Help

We understand that mornings can be hectic, but establishing a consistent routine at home can make a world of difference for your child. Here are a few tips to help your child arrive on time:

• Set a consistent bedtime: Ensuring your child gets enough sleep can help them wake up on time and feel ready for the day ahead.

- Prepare the night before: Lay out clothes, pack lunches, and organise school bags the evening before to minimise the morning rush.
- Plan for travel time: Factor in extra time for unexpected delays on the way to school.
- Your partnership in this is invaluable. Together, we can make sure that every child at Maunu School is set up for success each day.

We have a teacher only day scheduled for Friday the 25th of October. Please mark this on your calendar as School will be closed for instruction on this day.


BOOK WEEK
