In addition to these creative endeavours, we have been focusing on an important aspect of school life - supporting our tamariki in their behaviour and personal growth. As a **PB4L** (Positive

Behaviour for Learning) school, we are committed to teaching and reinforcing positive behaviour through our core values. Recently, we have noticed some undesirable behaviours cropping up, particularly as the term draws to a close.

Our teachers are working hard to remind students of the importance of using **Integrity**, demonstrating **Respect** in their language and interactions, taking **Responsibility** for their actions, and striving for **Excellence** in all that they do.

We believe every child has the right to feel safe, supported, and respected at school, and we need your help to reinforce these values at home. Please talk to your children about how they can be the best version of themselves, setting personal goals and coming to school **Curious** and ready to learn. Together, we can create a safe and positive environment where every student can thrive.

I have included this diagram called the 'Social Discipline Window.' This is a tool we are using with our team to help us understand the balance between building strong relationships and maintaining high expectations. While we understand that mistakes happen, we believe it is crucial for students to feel safe, cared for, and supported. At the same time, we want them to recognise the importance of rules and the need for everyone to follow them. We aim to be working in the 'With Restorative' quadrant to ensure there is care and concern, but wrapped in high expectations.

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS FOR 2025

The Maunu School Board of Trustees invites applications for students living out of zone to enrol at Maunu School for the period 13 December 2024 to 10 March 2025. The school's enrolments scheme details are available from the school's office along with application forms. The Board of Trustees have determined that we have places available for out of zone students in the following year level – **Year 1 students who will be 5 before the 10th of March 2025.** We have up to 10 places available. The deadline for receipt of applications is Tuesday October 15, 2024.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required, it will be held on Wednesday, October 16 2024. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within 3 school days of the ballot being held.
