Encouraging Regular School Attendance: Building Good Habits for Life

One of the key priorities for both the Government and schools is ensuring our tamariki attend school regularly. The goal is for 80% of students to attend more than 90% of the time - essentially missing fewer than five days per term. Why? Because consistent attendance leads to better learning outcomes, stronger friendships, and positive lifelong habits.

At Maunu School, we understand that sometimes children get sick or have unavoidable absences, but we also know that small changes can make a big difference. Here's how we can all support regular attendance:

Set good routines – Establishing a morning routine makes getting out the door smoother.

✓ Talk positively about school – Show excitement about what your child will learn each day.

Stay connected – Let us know if there are any challenges affecting attendance so we can support you.

Be mindful of appointments – Where possible, schedule them outside of school hours.

Every day at school is a chance to grow, discover, and connect. Let's work together to ensure our children make the most of their learning opportunities.

PB4L AT MAUNU SCHOOL

Our Maunu School Five Feather Values - Respect/ Hei Whakanui, Responsibility/ Takohanga, Excellence/ Whakaaro Pai, Integrity/ Kia Túpono and Curiosity/ Kia Tirotiro are the foundation of our **Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L)** programme.

PB4L involves explicitly teaching students the expected behaviours in different areas, and situations around the school, so that students know what to do and how to behave.

The behaviours are listed under the different values, such as to show responsibility in the classroom we need to clean up after ourselves and put everything away. This is taught and shown explicitly what is meant, and the students practise this.

Through PB4L we are able to access funding to support initiatives around the school, such as our amazing hut building area, providing resourcing for our sensory room, a new stand-alone

basketball hoop, so that students can practise basketball without getting in the way of the soccer players, and the Five Feather Value Wristbands to acknowledge good behaviour. The fund was also used to help pay for all the new games painted in our playgrounds.

Throughout the year we will continue to implement new ideas to assist with improving our environment and ways to encourage, and acknowledge appropriate behaviour.




Rally Day – Sunday 6th April, 1PM
